## WHAT IS A UNION?

A Union is a not-for-profit organisation where workers come together to look after each other at work.

Unions are made up of workers to improve the wages and conditions.

There are many unions which service different industries and sectors.

As an employee of the Local Government, Utilities, Energy, Airlines and Clerical and Administration industries, your Union is the United Services Union.

A worker who belongs to a Union is called a member.

Your membership fees fund the union's work, including representing workers in disputes, negotiating better wages and conditions, and providing services like journey insurance and some legal services.
